## China-California Joint side event at COP20 in Lima

China and California's low carbon and climate change collaboration has been a model of subnational engagement, through which both sides have benefitted from information and personnel exchange, sharing of lessons learned, and opportunities for related trade and investment. The China-California joint side event at COP20 in Lima will present the collaboration efforts from both sides across various areas including air pollution mitigation, emission trading, zero-emission vehicles, clean-tech and trade.
